

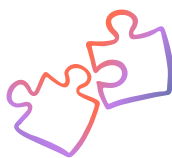

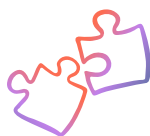

Marie Curie was a brilliant **scientist**. She was the first woman to win a **Nobel** Prize and the first person ever to win two! When her daughter, **Irène**, was old enough, she joined her mother's research **team**, experimenting to find ways to use **radiation** to help **heal** people. During World War I, Marie developed **portable** X-ray **machines** called "Les Petites Curies" (the Little Curies). She and 17-year-old Irène brought them to the front lines to help the wounded **soldiers**. Their **pioneering** work and **brave** actions saved countless lives. The pair also opened up a **hospital** for, and run entirely by, **women**.
